

Job Title: Art Studio Work Study

#### **Position Overview:**

The student will assist with the everyday upkeep of the Art Studio (HUM 115) and the art supplies that are used in class. Additionally, the Art Studio work study will assist with art-related events and campus exhibits.

# **Key Responsibilities:**

- Cleaning and organizing the art studio
- Help identify when supplies are running low and assist with replenishing supplies in their proper places when new supplies arrive.
- The work-study student will remain in the Art Studio during designated "Open Studio" hours throughout the week. This time is for art students to come in and work on projects independently as needed. The work-study student will keep an eye on the classroom and art supplies and be able to assist students if the instructor is not available.
- The work-study student will help with art-related events, such as setting up and organizing campus art exhibits and creating related promotional materials.

### **Qualifications:**

- Must be currently enrolled as a student at Otero College with at least one studio art class per semester
- A desire to become a professional artist
- A background in the visual arts with experience using and maintaining many different art supplies
- Ability to work effectively both independently and collaboratively within a team
- Dependable and punctual

### Work Schedule:

This position requires a commitment of up to 15 hours per week, with a flexible schedule based on the student's availability and the needs of the Art Studio.
